<u>Unit 4</u>: Analysing and Producing: 40% a 2-hour examination.

There are two sections in the examination paper and you must complete both.

Section A (62 marks)

Questions 1-4 will test your musical understanding, your ability to manipulate and correct recorded music and your ability to write commentaries on technological processes.

Section B (18 marks)

Question 5 will be a practical test involving the production of a balanced stereo mix.

You will have an audio CD which will contain a series of music files to be imported into music production software. You will also have an examination paper in which some or all of the CD tracks will be notated as conventional staff notation, editing grids or numerical data.

You will be required to review the materials, commenting on musical elements and technological processes, identifying mistakes and discrepancies and correcting them and, finally, producing a stereo mix.
